## Professor Mark Solms, Department of Psychology, University of Cape Town, South Africa:

'Clinical Implications of Neuropsychoanalysis'

September 21, 2017, at 14-16, CSS, room 1.1.18, Øster Farimagsgade 5

Professor Solms will describe the basic brain mechanisms that are involved in psychopathology, and, based on this, he will outline and explain the brain mechanisms of common psychotherapeutic and psychopharmacological treatments. He will discuss how and why psychotherapy works, and how it differs (neurologically) from drug therapy. Lastly, he will address the question: how well do these treatments work and what does this mean for psychoanalysis?

Solms founded the International Neuropsychoanalysis Society in 2000 and was a Founding Editor (with Ed Nersessian) of the journal Neuropsychoanalysis. He has published widely in both neuroscientific and psychoanalytic journals, including Cortex (journal), Neuropsychologia, Trends in Cognitive Sciences and Behavioral and Brain Sciences. He has published more than 250 articles and book chapters, and 6 books. His book (with Oliver Turnbull), "The Brain and the Inner World" has been translated into 13 languages.
